Evidence utilized in the design of the costed plan	In addition to the corporate evaluations carried out by the Evaluation Office which contributed to the development of the new Programme (9th cycle), a joint evaluation of the UNDAF was carried out. An Adolescent Investment Case was done at the beginning of the 8 th cycle to provide decision-makers and partners in Burundi with a modelled framework for investing in interventions, mainly in health, education and employment, in order to improve the well-being of adolescent girls and boys and their participation in development. The contribution of youth participation to peace building has been assessed, and will inform the new Youth Peace and Security national policy which is currently under development.
