Gap mapping/analysis of relevant evaluative evidence and knowledge gaps that are strategically important to inform the design and implementation of the upcoming country programme	<p>Based on the priorities identified in the UNFPA Country Programme (CP) (2026-2030) for Indonesia, several areas require further evaluative evidence to accelerate the achievement of UNFPA's transformative results. By addressing these knowledge gaps, UNFPA can enhance the effectiveness of its country programme and accelerate progress towards its transformative results in Indonesia. The priorities where evaluative evidence is essential to design and implement the next country programme include: (a) improving the quality of midwifery education to address challenges within the existing pre-service and in-service programmes, and developing a Continuing Professional Development programme for midwives; (b) improving to governance mechanisms for planning and budgeting for sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence programming at the sub-national level, and scaling up the model for shifting from funding to financing by mobilizing Islamic Financing and by promoting knowledge exchange through strategic partnerships under South-South and Triangular Cooperation; (c) advancing population dynamic data analysis to inform policies addressing megatrends and disparity issues; (d) strengthening national and sub-national capacity to prevent and respond to gender-based violence and harmful practices (child marriage and female genital mutilation), including during humanitarian crisis, by transforming harmful social norms, cultural beliefs, and legal frameworks that perpetuate these practices; (e) integrating Adolescent Reproductive Health education into the national education curriculum to reach youth and prevent gender-based violence and harmful</p>

	<p>practices; and (f) strengthening sub-national capacity to ensure provision of sexual reproductive health, prevention and management of GBV in humanitarian situations.</p> <p>The Better Reproductive Health and Rights for All in Indonesia phase two (BERANI II) evaluation will assess sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence interventions, including the training and empowerment of midwives, the strengthening of governance mechanisms for planning and budgeting, scaling of successful models, and capacity development to address gender-based violence and harmful practices. The evaluation of the Adolescent Reproductive Health education programme will provide evidence on effective approaches to reach youth and prevent gender-based violence and harmful practices, guiding adjustments and expansions to integrate adolescent reproductive health education into the national curriculum. The United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) evaluation will assess United Nations (UN) agencies' contributions to national priorities and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It will also generate evidence and lessons learned for accountability and learning and provide actionable recommendations for organisational learning and the next UNSDCF formulation.</p> <p>The planned evaluations will generate valuable evidence and learning, strengthen accountability, and ensure a balanced focus on key outcome areas contributing to the achievement of UNFPA's transformative results and Indonesia's development goals.</p>
