A careful assessment of available evidence at country, regional, and centralized levels was conducted (please see <u>MAPPING EVALUATIVE EVIDENCE</u> : Kazakhstan 2025) to identify knowledge gaps that require further evaluation. To close the identified data gaps related to new CPD outputs 1 and 2 the following key aspects were considered to address areas necessary to accelerate the achievement of the country programme's strategic priorities, particularly in the areas of Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) and Gender-Based Violence (GBV). For output 3, consideration of the rapid evolution of demographic and gender-related challenges necessitates a continuous evaluation of interventions to ensure their relevance and effectiveness. An analysis of previous evaluations at national, regional, and global levels highlighted areas where additional data and insights are needed to refine programme strategies and interventions.
