These include: The UNFPA Thailand 11th Country Programme Evaluation (CPE) for the period 2017-2021 was conducted in 2020 by an independent evaluation team in accordance with the UNFPA Policy 2019 and UNFPA Evaluation Handbook 2019. The overall EQA for CPE report is rated "very good". The CPE provided several strategic and programmatic recommendations that are useful and have been used to formulate the 12th Country Programme of Thailand. The Development Evaluation of Results-Based Management at UNFPA conducted in 2019 by the Evaluation Office. The evaluation recommended UNFPA to enhance the organizational development of RBM solutions. Thailand Office will be actively involved in implementing organization-wide initiatives to improve evaluation culture and practices and integrated relevant activities below. Evaluation of UNFPA support to the prevention, response to and elimination of gender based violence (GBV) including harmful practices (HP) 2012-2017 highlights the importance of quality evidence to support countries in strengthening their focus on prevention programmes and services, and informing the national implementation of international commitments and gender policies and legislation. CP12 will contribute to UNFPA response and prevention to reduce GBV and harmful practices through strengthening evidence and focusing on social norms change as well as systematic production and exchange of learning and knowledge through South-South and Global Cooperation initiatives in the area of GBV and harmful practices as recommended by this evaluation.
