With more than 50 % of the Algerian population being under 30 and a simultaneously high unemployment rate within this demographic group, a focus on the promotion of employment is essential for Algeria's future socioeconomic stability. In our opinion, there is great potential in linking these ambitions to transformations in the energy sector (expansion of renewable energy and hydrogen) and a shift to a green economy in general. Furthermore, there are intersections regarding gender equality and improvements in employment promotions. We therefore welcome a possible cooperation with the UNFPA	This recommendation is welcomed, the first discussion with the German Ambassador has already been initiated, and we would be delighted to collaborate with the German Government in the areas of climate change, energy and green economy and the link to SRHR, gender equality, women empowerment, and strengthening job opportunities among young people and women.
The Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) is planning a project regarding the promotion of female entrepreneurship. Baseline: 41.7% (2019); Target: Decrease in percentage (to be determined by the national partner". This replaces the previous indicator.

This same (new) indicator has also been added under output 2 since the previous indicator no longer exists in the finalized UNSDCF.

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
