## **Extensions of country programmes**

Summary

The present note contains information on the extensions of UNFPA country programmes. First-time extensions of country programmes up to one year are approved by the Executive Director and presented to the Executive Board for information. All other requests for extensions of country programmes are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the first-time one-year extensions of the country programmes for Brazil and Haiti, as presented in table 1, and may wish to approve the second one-year extensions for Afghanistan and Algeria, the third one-year extension for Venezuela, the sixth, six-month extension for the Syrian Arab Republic and the sixth one-year extension for Yemen, as presented in table 2
