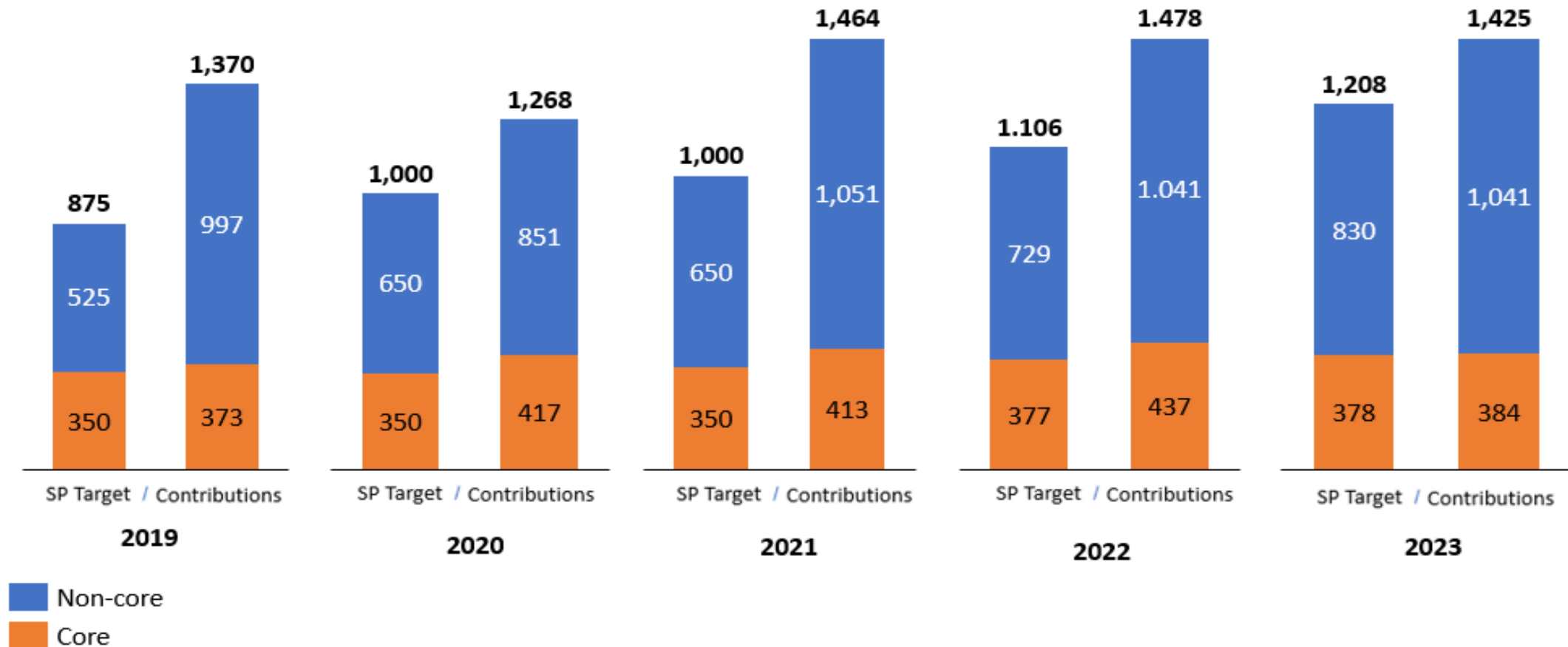

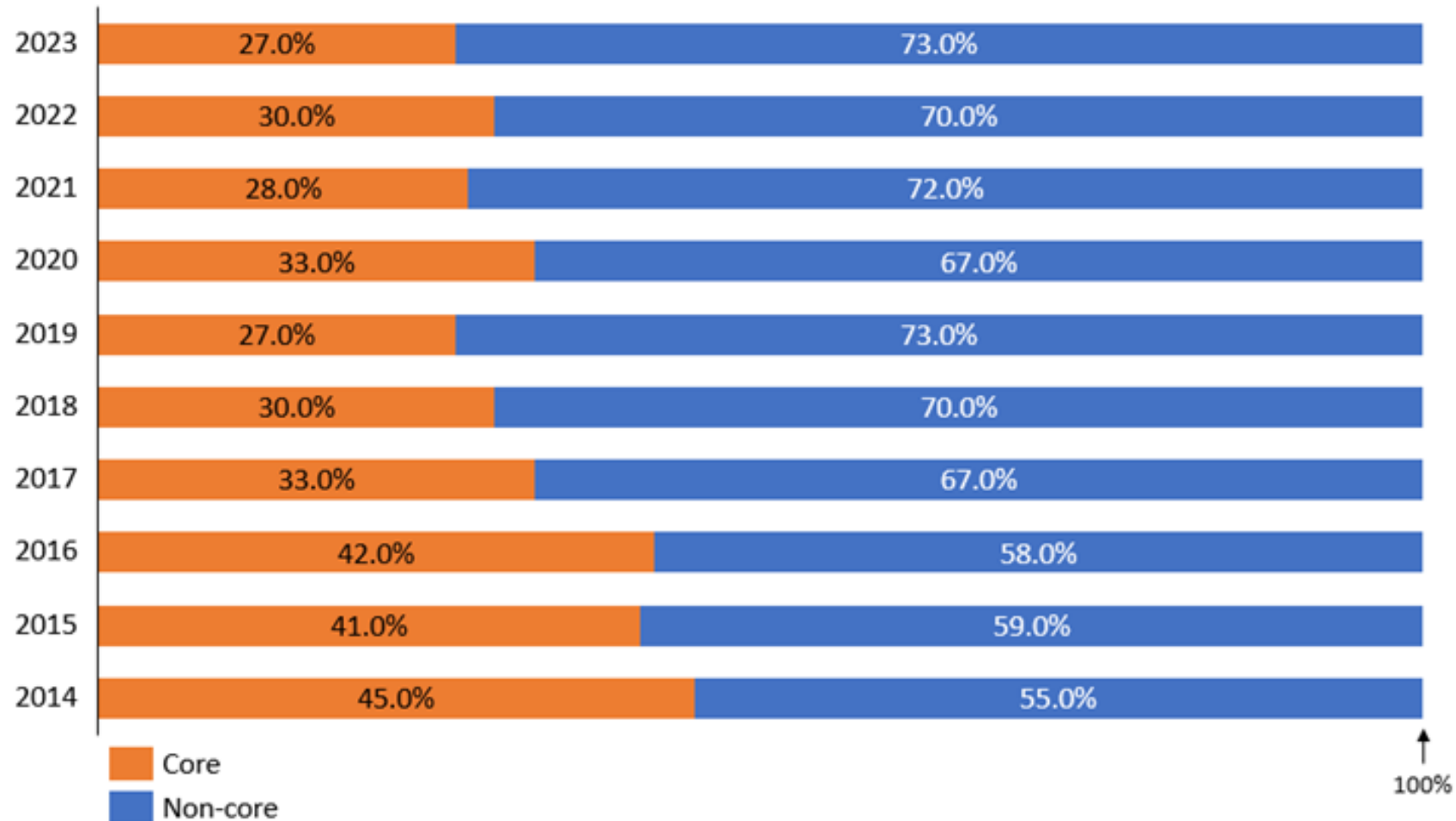
# Overall Funding Situation

Strategic Plan targets compared to actual contributions received in 2019-2023 (in millions of \$)



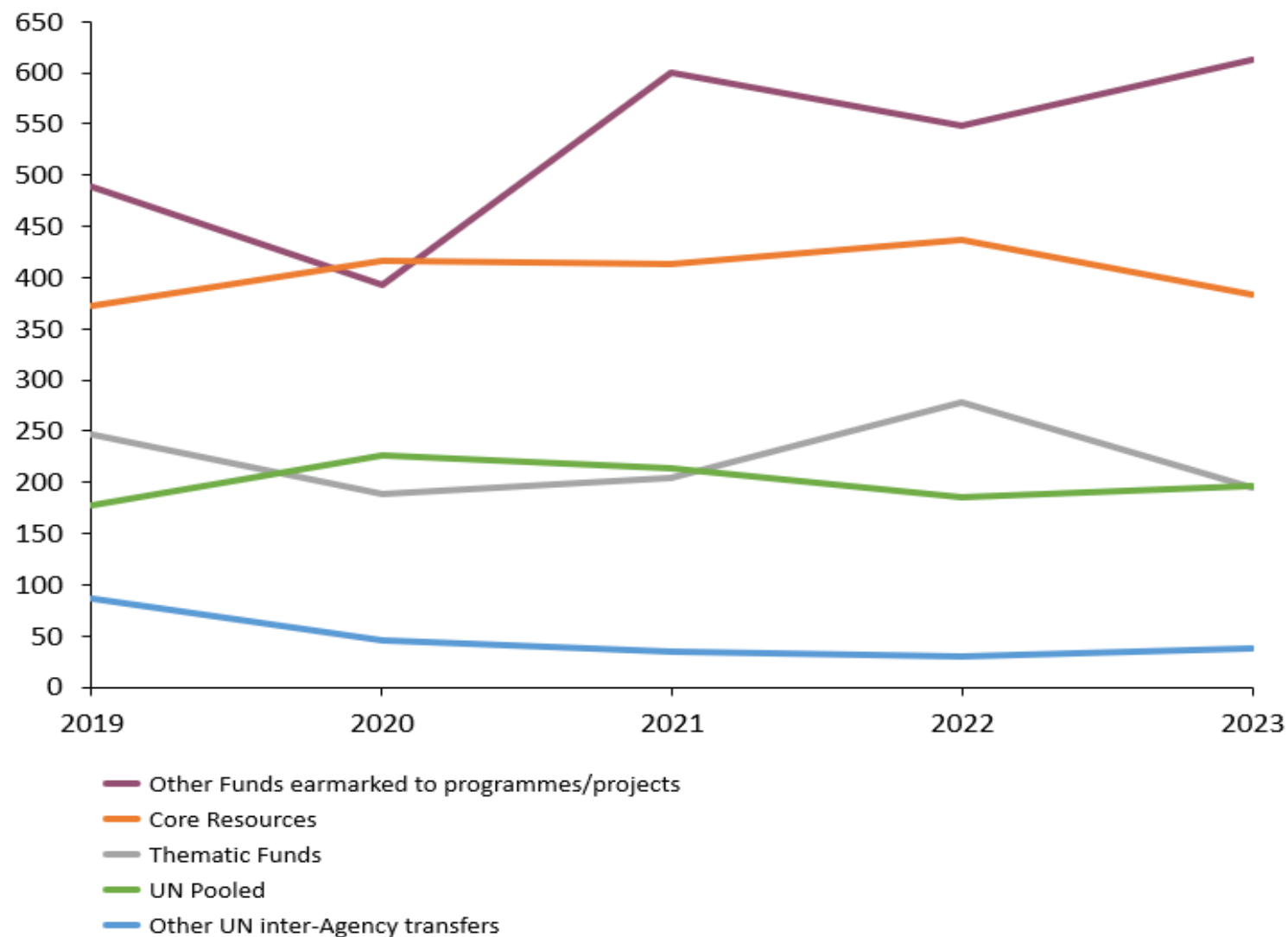
# Funding Compact Resource Trends

## Core vs Non-core Funding Ratio

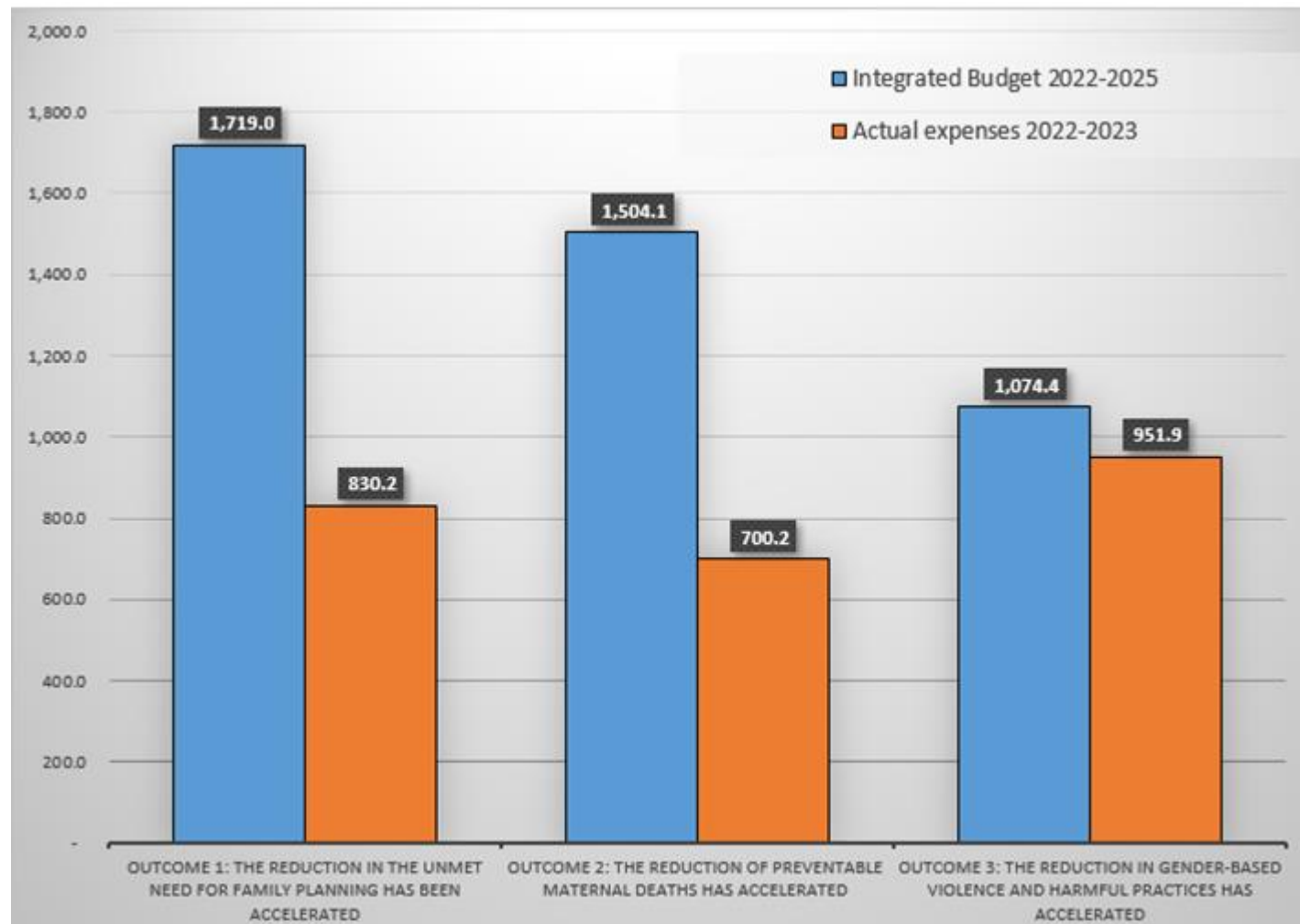

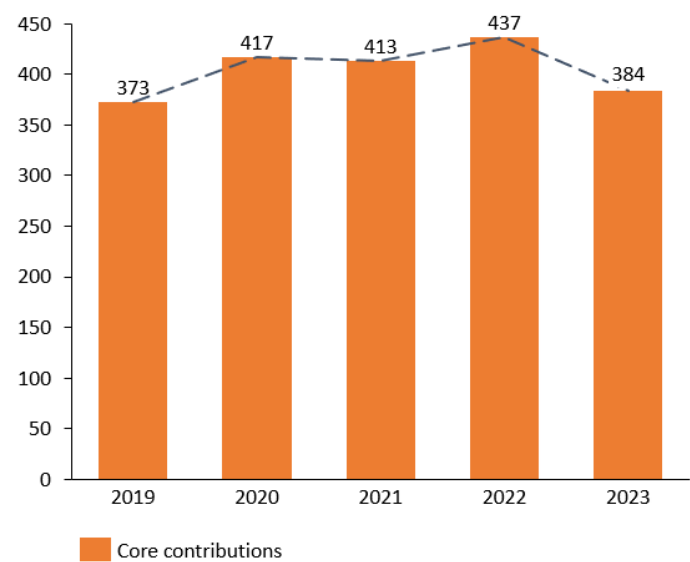

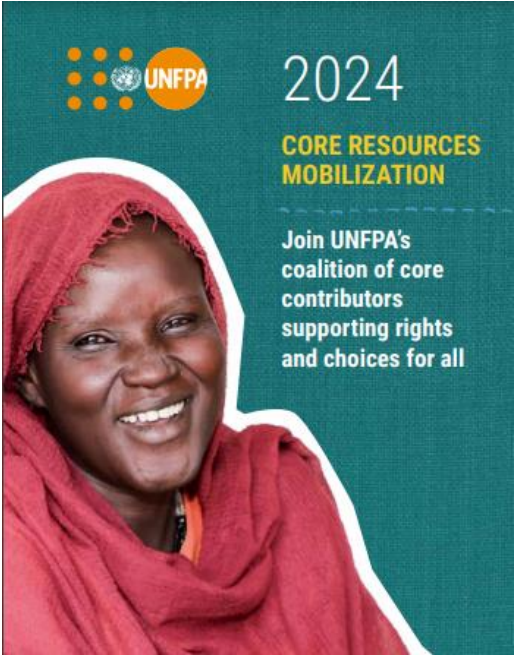
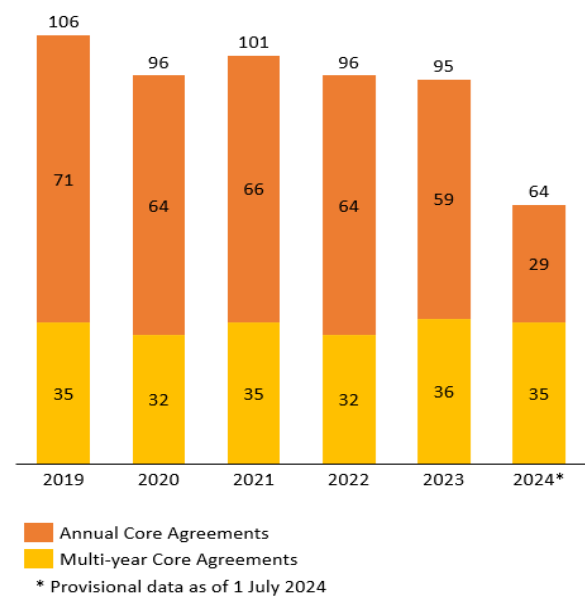
# Indicative resources (2022-2025) vs. actual expenses (2022-2023)



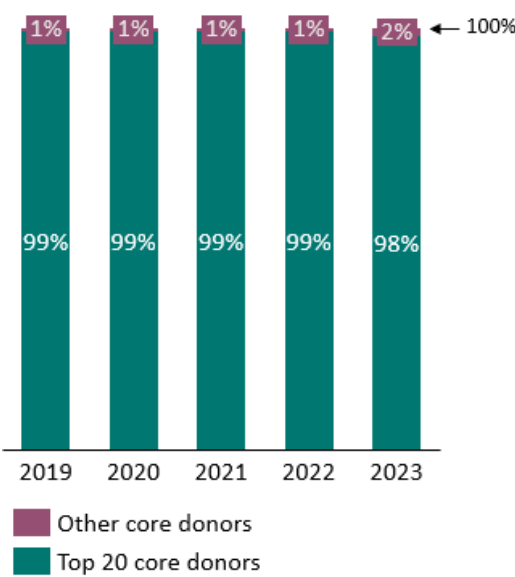
# Core Funding (2019-2023) in US\$

**National governments are an important source of country programme funding.**

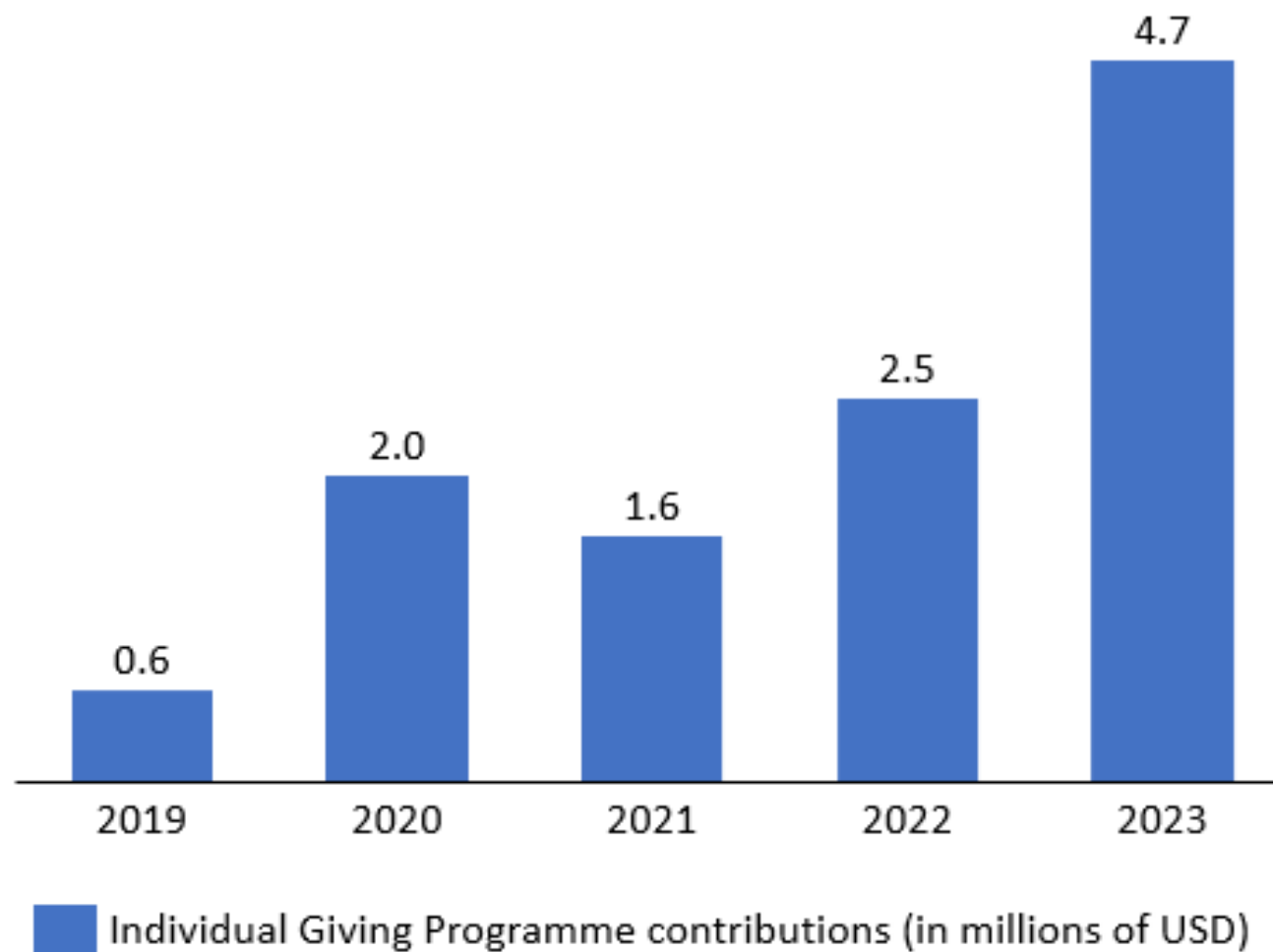

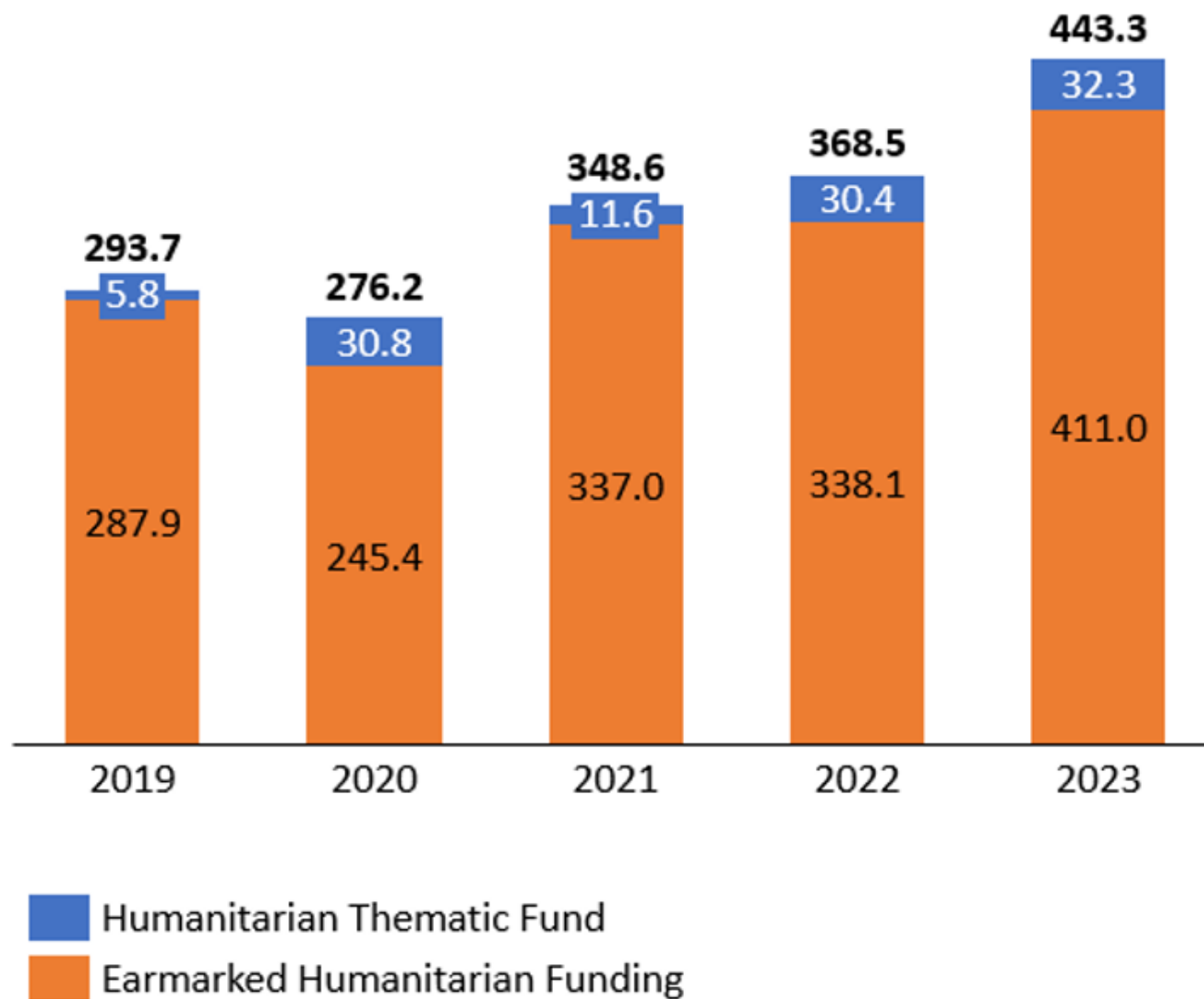

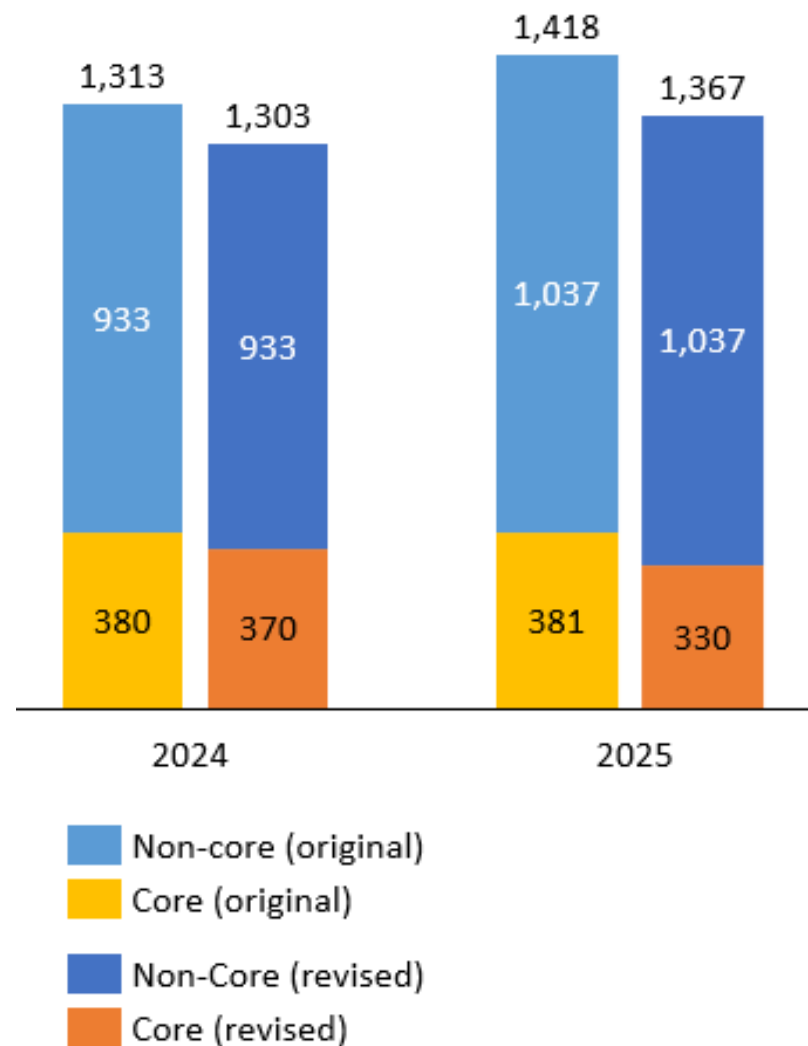
