Reaching women and girls in crisis

UNFPA and the EU work together to ensure women and girls in humanitarian settings receive critical support before, during, and after crises. Across 21 countries, this partnership ensures access to SRH services and GBV prevention and response. In Syria and Ukraine, EU funding supports mobile clinics and GBV survivor services. In Jordan's Zaatari Refugee Camp, EU-backed clinics offer comprehensive health care, outreach, and case management.

European Union funding makes a difference

EU funding delivers lasting results. In Venezuela, indigenous women and girls gain access to care. In Kenya, EU support is helping end FGM through improved services and local engagement. Across the region, the EU also promotes positive masculinity and challenges harmful gender norms, reflecting our shared commitment to leaving no one behind.
