42 journalists improved their knowledge and capacity on national and international mechanisms for combating violence against women and girls

2

80 youth, including youth with disabilities, benefited from capacity strengthening on healthy behaviour and sexual and reproductive health

3

Prevention materials were developed in Braille for blind youth and adolescents on sexually transmitted infections, the human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (STI/HIV/AIDS), demonstrating innovation in reaching marginalized populations

The first national strategy to address gender-based violence was developed, establishing a framework for multi-sectoral gender-based violence prevention and response

2

94 per cent of health facilities reported no contraceptive stockouts, ensuring consistent nationwide access to family planning services

3

The national gender policy's operational plan was integrated into all five regional development plans

4

The first One Stop Centre for gender-based violence was established at Balbala Hospital, providing integrated medical, psychosocial and legal support to survivors

5

Over 12,000 new users benefited from modern contraceptive methods, and over 12,800 women and girls received sexual and reproductive health information and services

Over 8,200 girls accessed information about social, health and economic empowerment topics through Noura, the National Girl Empowerment Initiative

3

204 learning safe spaces were established to provide safe environments for girls' education and empowerment

4

Anti-female genital mutilation (FGM) curriculum was integrated into medical school programmes at 20 universities, combating medicalization of FGM through education of medical professionals

5

Operational service delivery points were established in East Alexandria district (San Stefano), offering a range of comprehensive services for maternal health and other reproductive health services for protection and response to gender-based violence and addressing harmful practices

6

Four new economic empowerment units were established with the National Council for Women are linking gender-based violence survivors from the Women's Complaints Office with vocational programmes for socioeconomic empowerment

15 primary health centres were upgraded into Centres of Excellence for Integrated Comprehensive Reproductive Health Services

A functional electronic logistics management information system (e-LMIS) for reproductive health commodities was implemented in all districts

4

The first national census for population and housing in some 40 years was conducted in 2024

5

Three key coordination mechanisms were established or strengthened, enhancing multi-sectoral responses: Adolescent and Youth Inter-agency Working Group, Adolescent Girls Task Force and Youth Advisory Council

Jordan developed a National Action Plan for the Prevention and Response to Child Protection Issues, Gender-Based Violence, and Family Violence for 2025–2030

3

The Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) for sexual and reproductive health in crisis situations readiness assessment for Jordan was finalized as part of a regional initiative that addressed critical aspects of sexual and reproductive health and population dynamics

4

The final draft of the first periodic report (2021–2025) for monitoring and evaluating the National Population Strategy (2021–2030) performance indicators was completed and launched

Five municipalities implemented an advocacy and partnership tool guide to integrate gender, gender-based violence, sexual and reproductive health, and youth considerations into their action plans

46 out of 81 assessed primary healthcare centres demonstrated implementation of the Gender-Based Violence–Sexual and Reproductive Health (GBV–SRH) integration model by providing prevention and treatment services, including awareness and case management

Over 567 adolescent girls benefited in specialized programmes informed by the Adolescent Girls' Social, Economic, and Health Assets Framework developed by UNFPA and the Adolescent Girls Against All Odds initiative

Five new referral mechanisms were established at the municipal level, creating conducive environments to deliver protection services that are people-centred, non-discriminatory and rights-based

3

10 guidelines supporting Women and Girls' Safe Spaces were developed and implemented, formalizing municipal-level service standards

4

Over 62,700 displaced persons accessed basic services, while over 10,700 migrant and refugee women, girls and newborns benefited from sexual and reproductive health services

5

19 new primary healthcare facilities provided maternal health services through mobile medical teams and distribution of medical supplies, including reproductive health commodities

6

A National Youth Policy was developed with participation from young people

The National Strategy for Older Persons 2024–2030 was elaborated and disseminated, strengthening the policy framework for addressing the needs of older populations

2

Policy documents were developed to support inclusive public policies that respect the human rights of women and girls, including a paper on “Investing in Midwifery in Morocco” and a policy brief on “Partnerships for the Promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Health in Morocco”

3

A multi-stakeholder consultation mechanism was established to support the rights of young girls, enhancing coordination among different actors working on gender equality and youth rights

4

Seven innovative tools were developed to ensure continuity of essential services, including the platform for electronic medical records for prisons, the SHAGA+ application for young people with autism, and new mechanisms to report violence at community level

5

Subnational databases across 10 regions were established, ensuring national coverage of regional databases to improve data management and access to data for evidence-based programming

2

Health facilities with capacity to provide family planning methods increased to 93 per cent in 2024, a 4.35 per cent increase from 2023, following the training of 120 new health workers from 60 new health facilities

3

The UNFPA–UNICEF Joint Programme on the Elimination of Female Genital Mutilation supported dialogues and sensitization in 47 communities to enable consensus to work towards ending this harmful practice

4

Over 12,200 women and girls received services in line with guidance in the Essential Services Package for Women and Girls Subject to Violence, including gender-based violence survivors in settlements for internally displaced persons

5

Over 3,800 adolescent girls at risk of child marriage accessed strategic socioeconomic interventions, including social enterprise grants, menstrual hygiene kits and vocational skills training

6

The updated list of SDG indicators incorporated new indicators generated from the 2025 Somali Integrated Household Budget Survey, strengthening the national framework for monitoring progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals

Over 97,900 people accessed youth-friendly health services, maternal and child helplines, and gender-based violence multi-sectoral services from 16 safe spaces

5

UNFPA led key coordination structures for sexual and reproductive health and rights, gender-based violence, and humanitarian and development efforts, including the Sexual and Reproductive Health Gaza Working Group and the Gender-Based Violence Sub-Cluster

The Adolescent and Youth Health Humanitarian Response Strategy was developed in cooperation with the Palestinian Coalition for Adolescent Health and the Ministries of Health and Education

Over 250,000 women, men, girls and boys in Gaza and the West Bank accessed life-saving sexual and reproductive health services, cash assistance, dignity kits and other essential supplies

2

Cash and voucher assistance was implemented in eight states to enable internally displaced women to access sexual and reproductive health services

3

38 community-based obstetric referral mechanisms were established in Blue Nile (18) and Kassala states (20), strengthening emergency obstetric care pathways

4

Over 30 communities in three states made public declarations of abandonment of female genital mutilation, engaging in advocacy and advancing efforts to eliminate this harmful practice

5

Over 15,000 persons accessed HIV testing, family planning, psychosocial support and awareness services

6

Mobile clinics were implemented in 13 localities across six states expanding access to healthcare in conflict-affected areas

The Arabic version of the comprehensive sexuality education curriculum was implemented in collaboration with the School Health Department and the National Reproductive Health Programme, to train health educators and pre-trained health workers

The comprehensive sexuality education integration process successfully relaunched in 2024 with the support of 301 teachers from 39 schools across 13 pilot regions

The first-ever georeferenced digital and fully integrated census was conducted in Tunisia, setting a new standard for data collection national capabilities

4

The first national gender-based violence prevention and awareness plan was developed

5

The National Maternal Death Surveillance and Response system evaluation was finalized

6

A consultative youth board was established and empowered under the Ministry of Youth, contributing to strategic planning and vision-setting for youth policies

126 health facilities and mobile clinics received UNFPA support to deliver essential maternal and newborn care, comprehensive family planning services, and emergency obstetric and newborn care (EmONC)

3

A reproductive health voucher programme was implemented in nine districts across four governorates, serving over 3,100 individuals and removing barriers to essential services

4

More than 121,000 young people participated in youth programme initiatives, with over 15,000 accessing health services through youth-friendly clinics and 5,800 improving employability skills

5

A comprehensive cash assistance programme was integrated into gender-based violence case management across 20 governorates, benefiting over 8,400 survivors and women at risk

6

The 2024 population projections, disaggregated by sex and age, were produced using data from the Central Statistical Organization (CSO) and adjusting for the movement of internally displaced persons

Key Results Achieved in 2024



1

Over 4 million people accessed high-quality reproductive, maternal, neonatal, child and adolescent health services through 533 midwife-led Family Health Houses in 26 provinces

2

Over 34,000 health workers in remote locations received technical assistance through the Midwifery Helpline to respond to maternal health cases

3

Over 7 million internally displaced persons, returnees and host communities accessed services through mobile health teams and static health facilities

4

Over 2 million women and girls benefited from psychosocial support information and services through specialized centres and teams across all 34 provinces

5

Over 774,000 adolescents and youth accessed sexual and reproductive health information and counselling services through 152 integrated youth-friendly facilities

6

Over 57,000 persons with disabilities benefited from inclusive services spanning maternal health, psychosocial support and meaningful youth engagement initiatives

73 per cent of Upazila Health Complexes in 22 priority districts provided midwifery-led services resulting in 154,000 vaginal deliveries, 112,000 women accessing post-partum family planning, and 4,300 women receiving referrals through survivor-centred gender-based violence services

2

Comprehensive life skills education was institutionalized within Bangladesh's national curriculum for grades six to nine, achieving 60 per cent coverage of the international framework's recommendations

3

The Bangladesh National Family Planning Strategy (2023–2030) was endorsed by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare

4

The Ministry of Health finalized the Comprehensive Climate Change Health-National Adaptation Plan to address climate change impacts on sexual and reproductive health service delivery, with a first-ever National Standard Operating Procedure for Green Healthcare

5

The Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) for sexual and reproductive health in crisis situations was institutionalized through implementation guidelines and costing in the 5th Operational Plan of maternal, newborn, child and adolescent health

6

The governments of Bangladesh, Bulgaria and Japan, together with UNFPA, hosted the ICPD30 Global Dialogue on Demographic Diversity and Sustainable Development

All designated comprehensive emergency obstetric and newborn care (EmONC) centres now implement maternal and neonatal death reporting and review, near-miss reporting and expanded contraceptive choice through implant introduction

2

61 per cent of schools have at least two teachers trained with knowledge and skills to deliver comprehensive sexuality education in line with international standards, with teachers trained in an additional 59 schools

3

Key guidance was developed included an integrated reproductive, maternal, newborn, child and adolescent health strategy; an action plan for the National Gender Quality Policy; and a National Strategy and Framework of Action on the Elimination of Gender-Based Violence

4

50 per cent of districts have functional multi-sectoral coordination mechanisms with trained committee members to prevent and respond to gender-based violence and harmful practices

5

Sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence components were integrated into the revised Health Emergency and Disaster Contingency Plan, ensuring service continuity during emergencies

6

An action plan to implement the National Senior Citizen Policy was developed, and use of National Transfer Accounts was initiated to strengthen demographic resilience

Over 312,000 adolescents and youth, including users from diverse and marginalized groups, accessed verified sexual and reproductive health information through the Youth Health Mobile App

5

Over 1.3 million people were reached through social and behaviour change communication campaigns featuring educational videos and posters on critical topics from early marriage to domestic violence

87 per cent of primary and secondary schools in nine priority provinces implemented comprehensive sexuality education

4

The Cambodia Strategic Framework 2024–2030 was approved, reinforcing commitment to implementing the ICPD Programme of Action and providing a framework for line ministries and provinces to mobilize actions and resources

Gender-based violence response was strengthened through six new government coordination groups, guidelines for national One Stop Service Units, case management orientation, campaigns, and launch of the Gender-Based Violence Safe App addressing harmful social and gender norms

Three cross-national youth networks were established to connect Chinese youth with their peers in Kenya and Mongolia through South–South cooperation, focusing on innovation, sexual and reproductive health and rights, climate change and youth leadership

2

Comprehensive sexuality education was implemented in the ethnic minority area of Muli through teacher training and student workshops, with youth networks for peer education developed in schools and communities

3

Two national policy documents on ageing and fertility support were issued by the State Council in 2024

4

11 provinces with a high sex ratio at birth engaged in policy dialogues on son preference and gender-biased sex selection, developing targeted measures to address gender inequality

5

The “No More Silence” mobile app was launched for women with hearing impairments, providing accessible information on sexual and reproductive health, risk assessment of domestic violence, service map navigation and sign language support

770 Women and Girls Friendly Gram Panchayats (village councils) were created across all districts, while the Madhya Pradesh government launched the Devi Ahilyabai Nari Shakti Mission, a drive for women's empowerment

3

Two new and lesser-used contraceptive methods were rolled out in an additional six states in 2024 to expand method mix and choice

4

Over 120,000 users accessed accurate, stigma-free information on sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights and mental health through "Just Ask", an innovative AI-enabled multilingual chatbot

5

Blockchain technology was piloted in Odisha for One Stop Centre information-sharing while multi-sectoral gender-based violence response coordination was strengthened in collaboration with police in Rajasthan

6

Strategic dialogues and capacity-building initiatives on National Transfer Accounts (NTA) resulted in a policy focus on optimizing the Silver Dividend – the economic and social potential of an active elderly population

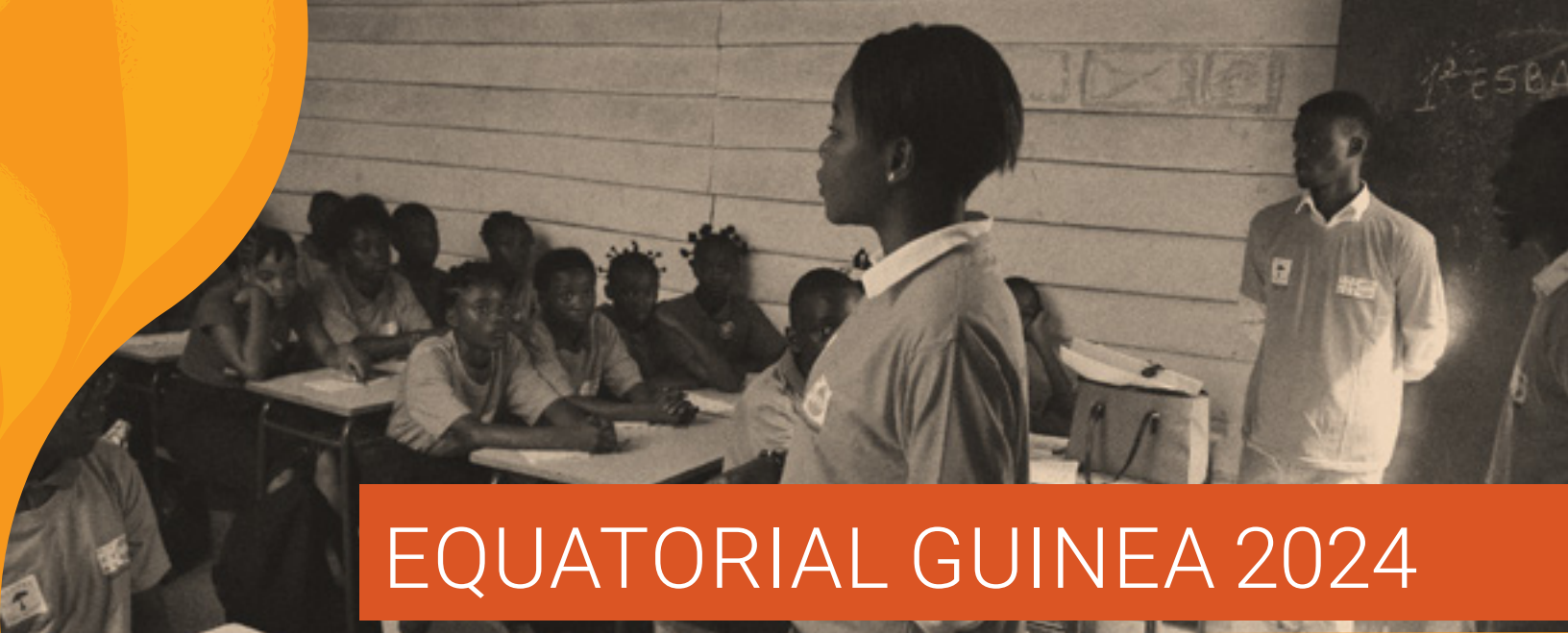
