Since the ceasefire, UNFPA has intensified its response, reaching 170,000 women and girls with sexual and reproductive health, protection, and shelter assistance. Emergency maternal healthcare supplies and equipment have been delivered, including generators for mobile clinics, shelter materials, and hygiene, dignity, and winterization kits. To strengthen maternal care, UNFPA has also provided electrical delivery beds, fetal dopplers for ultrasound monitoring, and machines to track fetal heart rates, ensuring safer births and improved care for mothers and newborns.

Despite these efforts, continued humanitarian support is essential to ensure women and girls can access the healthcare and protection services they urgently need.
